1. **Check out our website** <https://www.kps.vic.edu.au/> and visit the Home Learning Tabs for the year levels you are interested in.
2. **Look at the timetable** for the class or classes your child is in (and print out if needed). This timetable will remain consistent for all of Term 3 remote learning with the addition of a set Webex time to be added in week 2 of Home Learning. Year level Curriculum plans/overviews are also available to view on the website.
3. **Ensure you have access to Seesaw for Families** and Seesaw for **Students**. Both are needed for keeping up to date and informed.
4. The **daily schedule will be posted as the first slide each day on Seesaw (not the website as in Term 2)**, along with the **Daily Check-In**. It is essential each child checks in, in order to be marked present on the official school attendance register.
5. All **learning tasks will be delivered using Seesaw** and will contain information about what the lesson is **aiming to teach** and **why this learning matters**.
6. Children are expected to **complete the tasks** according to the timetable for the day and **submit these back to the teacher** for approval.
7. Your class teacher may send specific information to families within the class via the **messages tab on Seesaw as family announcements**. It is beneficial **to turn on notifications** in your **family app** so you have the latest information about schooling and any **updates that we must communicate** to families.
8. It is **very important to stay in contact with your child's teacher/teachers** at this time. The Seesaw app is the most reliable, however teachers are more than happy to communicate over the phone. Please be aware that phone calls from teacher's mobile phones may have no caller ID displayed.

Please contact the school at any time, we are here to assist and help wherever possible. Most importantly stay safe and look out for each other.
